Climate change, biodiversity loss, water stress, and shifting policy and consumer expectations are reshaping the way businesses operate — and demanding more robust, forward-looking risk management strategies. This interactive workshop convened by the World Business Council for Sustainable Development (WBCSD) will bring together leaders from the agriculture and food industry to explore emerging sustainability trends and the critical risks they pose to the sector.
